In addition to his litigation experience, Luis has an impressive and unique academic background, earning an M.A. and Ph.D. in history from the University of Chicago and working as a tenure-track Assistant Professor of History. His courses included a history of public health. While at the University of Chicago Luis was a Jefferson Scholar National Fellow at the University of Virginia (2013-14) and was recipient of a Fulbright Fellowship (2010-11). While earning his law degree, Luis served as a judicial extern for the Honorable Yvonne Gonzalez-Rogers at the Northern District of California and as a law clerk at the East Bay Community Law Center's Health and Welfare Practice. In 2019 he received the Prosser Prize in U.S. Civil Rights History.

Always interested in how health care is delivered, how patients can best be served, and how providers navigate the complexities of the practice, government regulations, and the business of medicine, Luis subsequently pursued a health care-focused legal career.
