Bryan Gustafson is an attorney whose academic and professional endeavors have formed a solid foundation for his health care law practice at HLB.

Prior to embarking on his legal career, Bryan made health care the focus of his studies, earning both an undergraduate and master's degree in public health from Johns Hopkins University and Dartmouth College, respectively.
