New University of Southern California (USC) School of Medicine and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health <u>joint research</u> indicates, unsurprisingly, that areas of LA County with the highest reported COVID case rates also experience a corresponding higher incidence of depression. By some accounts, just as unsurprising was data indicating that in areas more afflicted with COVID, non-Whites incurred an increased risk of depression compared to Whites residing in those same locations.
