

# Scotus Restricts Individuals' Ability to Sue States Under Medicaid

On June 26, the U.S. Supreme Court issued its decision in [Medina v. Planned Parenthood South Atlantic](#), ruling that the Medicaid Act's any-qualified provider provision does not contain language that clearly shows Congress's intent to create a private right of action against a state for non-compliance with the Medicaid Act. Since other provisions of the law similarly lack explicit language granting a private right of action, the ruling may have broader implications for future litigation under the Medicaid Act.
