SAN DIEGO – Revenue growth at Wildfire Systems Inc., the financial technology platform that powers loyalty and reward programs, shopping companions and content monetization, continues to blaze.

The fintech founded in 2017 is one of the region's fastest-growing companies, continually expanding its product offerings and

geographic reach. Wildfire also recently secured \$16 million in Series B funding. The most recent funding brings Wildfire's total raise to date \$36 million.

The current round is being co-led by Intuit Ventures and Mucker Capital, along with new investors Cohen Circle, Samsung Next, Evolution VC and Gaingels. Wildfire's existing investors TTV Capital, QED Investors, B Capital, DLA Piper, Moonshots Capital and

**Citi Ventures** also participated in the round.

The latest investment will accelerate the expansion of new features essential to the value-added services and benefits that Wildfire's clients extend to their customers, said Wildfire Systems founder and CEO Jordan Glazier.

Glazier said the company is in execution mode right now, with plans to leverage the new

Patching is a habit that can help all organizations – not just businesses. **IBM**, which tracks the cost of specific types of data breaches, noted that the cost of

a breach from a known and unpatched software vulnerability averages \$4.33 million.

Occasionally, unpatched software makes the headlines: a 2020 breach involving **SolarWinds** was a result of hackers targeting unpatched software. More recently, a faulty software update was blamed for the **CrowdStrike** outage

Administrators should patch known software vulnerabilities

"as soon as possible," said Brendan Daly, chief information security officer (or CISO)

at the **City of San Diego.** Such software should not be left unattended.

It's best to adhere to a regular patching cycle, he said. Standard patching should occur on at least a monthly cadence. Critical patches should be applied within 24 hours.

### **A Bigger Circle**

Fernanda Whitworth, widow of the late Relational Investors co-founder Ralph Whitworth, announced last week she was opening up the Curebound Whitworth Legacy Circle to new philanthropist members. The Legacy Circle honors Ralph Whitmore's commitment to the fight against cancer, which took his life in 2016.

"The work happening here in San Diego and across the country will benefit not only our children, but also future generations who may face the same frightening diagnosis that we did," Fernanda Whitworth said, adding that the Legacy Circle is "seeking a unique kind of donor" - people who are committed to funding advanced cancer treatment studies.

The announcement for expanding the Legacy Circle was timed for last week's National Estate Planning Awareness Week, and suggested philanthropists establish gifts to the fund through will or living trust, IRA rollover, charitable remainder or lead trust, gift annuity, retirement plan or life insurance policy.

The Legacy Circle is the latest in the Whitworth's cancer philanthropy, which includes establishing the Advanced Cell Therapy Lab at UC San Diego in 2014 and founding the nonprofit Immunotherapy Foundation in 2015, which later merged with Padres Pedal the Cause to form Curebound.

Interested philanthropists are encouraged to contact Curebound Senior Director of Stewardship + Development Operations Heather Dean-Presnall.

The 22nd District Agricultural Association – the organization that operates the Del Mar Fairgrounds last week announced it had repaid a \$4.7 million loan from the federal Paycheck Protection Program. The local DAA borrowed the money in 2020 after the pandemic closed operations due to the COVID-19

The PPP loan was initially forgiven by the Small Business Administration, but the U.S. Attorney's Office later questioned the standing on which the DAA could apply for the funds. A statement from 22nd DAA said there was "lack of clarity" in the 2020 CARES Act about "ill-defined 'state institutions' under the law" that led to it receiving the loan despite a clear explanation of the organization's "unusual structure" in the cover letter of its application.

The 22nd DAA paid back around \$5.6 million, without penalty, to cover the initial loan and interest. The DAA's statement also included insight to the organizations available cash in May 2020, around \$1.1 million, which was "far outpaced" by its accounts payable and deferred revenue. As of the end of August this year, the DAA reported a cash position of almost \$40 million.

# Natilus Debuts Plans for Blended-Wing Commercial Jet

**AEROSPACE:** Aims for 2030s Launch of Highly Efficient Design

SAN DIEGO – Aerospace manufacturer Natilus Inc. announced last week that it is developing a hyper-efficient blended-wingbody aircraft for commercial passenger use, with the goal of the aircraft entering service in the 2030s.

The Horizon aircraft will utilize a design that has no dividing lines between the fuselage of the plane and the wings. Blended-wing-body aircraft are significantly more fuel efficient than the common commercial aircraft design template, known as tube-and-wing aircraft.

According to Natilus, the Horizon is intended to serve the same market as the **Boe**ing 737 and the Airbus A320, with the ability to transport some 200 passengers with cargo across routes from Los Angeles to Boston and New York to London.

"With the blended wing body, it's, on average, roughly 30% more aerodynamic than your traditional tube and wing, because the shape of the fuselage generates more lift and

you don't need as much engine power and fuel burn," said Nolan Giblin, Natilus' head of business development.

Natilus was founded in the Bay Area in 2016 by Aleksey Matyushev and Anatoly Star before moving its headquarters to San Diego in 2021.

Since then, the company has attracted talent from defense giants like General Atomics and Northrop Grumman, including Giblin.

#### **Cargo Aircraft Development Continues**

Up until now, the company has primarily focused its efforts on developing a blendedwing-body design to serve the cargo shipping industry. That aircraft, the Kona, will be an autonomous plane capable of carrying more than 9,000 pounds of freight.

Natilus is currently constructing the first full-scale Kona prototype after flight testing smaller scale versions of the craft and analyzing its efficiency at the San Diego International Airport's wind tunnel, which is already used by Boeing and other aerospace companies.

Giblin said the company's development of the Kona is informing the early stages of the Horizon by utilizing existing off-the-shelf technology and adding vertical fins to the back of the aircraft in an effort to maximize stability and control.

"We are not trying to reinvent the wheel, the wheel just might look different," he said.

Natilus expects customer deliveries for the Kona to begin in late 2027 or early 2028 and has already received a \$134 million purchase order for 20 of the planes from the Texas-based cargo airline Ameriflight.

#### **Carbon Neutrality Goals Push Innovation**

The Horizon is being developed on a twin track with the Kona, with the expectation of beginning test flights by the end of the decade and beginning deliveries to customers in the 2030s.

That timing will be key, the company said, to helping the airline industry meet their goal

# Amplifica's Promising Hair Loss Meds

**BIOPHARMA:** Study Sheds New Hope for Hair Growth

DEL MAR – Clinical-stage biopharmaceutical company Amplifica Holdings Group, **Inc.** announced promising new results from its first in-human trial of its novel hair growth medication. The company's product – AMP-303 – is injected into the scalp to treat androgenetic alopecia (AGA), the most common form of hair loss.

"The ability to demonstrate measurable improvements in hair regrowth with just one treatment cycle of AMP-303 is a breakthrough in addressing androgenetic alopecia,' Amplifica Cofounder and Chief Scientific Officer Maksim Plikus, PhD told the Business Journal. "Advancements in hair loss treatment are challenging and have been extremely limited over many decades. In fact, since the approval of orally administered finasteride and topical minoxidil over 20 years ago, there have been no new FDA-approved medications to treat androgenetic alopecia. Additionally, these products require daily use by

patients for many months before seeing any potential results hence why the ability of AMP-303 to demonstrate hair growth from one treatment cycle is significant."

Amplifica's randomized, double-blind, placebo-controlled multicenter study evaluated the safety, tolerability and efficacy of the injection in men aged 18 to 45 years old with both recent onset hair loss (3 to 5 years) and long-standing hair loss (more than 10 years). Findings revealed

that subjects showed more than a 15% increase in non-vellus hair (the longer, thicker darker that grows from the top of the head) from baseline compared to placebo at 60 days post-treatment, and a greater than 10% increase compared to placebo at 150 days post-treatment.

The study also showed that a single treatment cycle increased non-vellus

> hair count and sustained the hair and thickness in participants 150 days

> after treatment. The medication's potential for reversing hair loss was demonstrated in its ability to stimulate the transition of vellus hairs (the 'peach fuzz' that grows all over the body) into non-vellus

> Amplifica says it identified natural signaling molecules that

can activate hair follicle stem cells, helping them return to the growth phase. Think of hair growth like a 3D printer.

"In its normal state, the printer – your hair follicles – alternates between printing – growing hair and taking breaks – resting,' explained Dr. Plikus. "Hair loss happens when the printer gets stuck in the resting phase and stops working. Our technology works like a signal that tells the printer it's time to start printing

again."

#### **Large Potential Market**

Androgenetic alopecia affects an estimated 50 million men and 30 million women in the U.S. It can start in a person's teenage years but increases in risk with age. According to the American Osteopathic College of Dermatology, it affects nearly 50% of males and 25%

# La Mesa Apartments Provide Middle Class 'Luxury Living'

**REAL ESTATE:** CityMark's \$20M Textur Project Includes Commercial Space

LA MESA – A \$20 million, four-story La Mesa apartment building, with plans for a groundfloor coffee shop, is meant to provide what developer CityMark is billing as "luxury living" for middle income tenants in a neighborhood that has historically been home to smaller projects.

Under construction by City-Mark at the corner of Wilson Street and Grossmont Boulevard, **Textur** will have 49 apartments.

"This project is in a part of La Mesa that is zoned for mixed-use, but it's not a part of La Mesa that has seen much development of that," said Eric Naslund, a principal of Studio E Architects which designed the project.

The name of the project, Textur, was chosen "to play off the multiple exterior finishes we are using, including siding accents," said Russ Haley, managing partner of CityMark.

"We're really excited about this one with just the level of different detailing rate that in the interior as well," Haley said.

We always want our architecture to be compelling, and this project is definitely that."

Due for completion in January 2026, Textur will have 27 one-bedroom apartments averaging 630 square feet and 22 two-bedroom apartments, averaging 1,000 square feet. Four of the apartments will be earmarked for low-income tenants.

"Most of the units are going to enjoy pretty nice views to Mount

on the exterior, and we were able to incorpo- Helix and out to the west," Naslund said. The project will also have 1,294 square feet

of commercial space where Haley hopes to attract a coffee shop as a tenant, a 730-square-foot gym, and 24 parking spaces.

A 900-square-foot lounge at the building entrance connects to the coffee shop space.

Naslund, who has deep family ties to La Mesa, said that the design of Textur takes neighborhood sensibilities into account.

# Flush with Cash, Cellibre Focusing on Bringing Sustainable Chemicals to Market **BIOTECH:** Company Raised \$6.7M at First Close of Funding Round

SAN DIEGO – Biotech company Cellibre **Inc.** closed the first portion of its current fundraising round this month, garnering nearly \$7 million in new funding.

The company disclosed a fundraise of \$6.7 million, with the goal of garnering \$10 million in total by the middle of January, according to CEO Ben Chiarelli. The company also has the ability to flex the fundraising ceiling up to \$20 million, if necessary.

"I don't know if our board is going to let us flex up that high, just given dilution and everything else," Chiarelli said. "And I think our insiders would much rather participate in the round than allow others to come in and dilute them at this stage, given all we have going on."

Cellibre focuses on programming cell DNA to produce enzymes that are more effective at producing chemicals to treat certain conditions while also maintaining a natural and sustainable chemical manufacturing process based on fermentation rather than chemical synthesis.

Whereas most other chemical production companies typically use E. coli or baker's yeast cells for fermentation-driven cell engineering, Cellibre takes what Chiarelli calls an "organism-agnostic" approach.

"What we do that's very, very different is we match whatever product we're trying to make

with a cell that's industrializable, that already makes the foundational chemistry that we care about," he said.

Chiarelli said the current difficulty in the private market and a lack of immediate need for cash drove the decision to split the fundraising round into multi-

ple closure dates. The private market will also get tighter around the winter holidays, he said.

"We've got pretty decent runway well into next year," Chiarelli said. "As of right now, we have commitments from insiders to extend that even further if we need to. So not under a ton of pressure from a capital perspective, (we're) really just trying to turn the business from an R&D organization to a commercial one."

#### **Multiple Platforms**

Cellibre's chemical production is generally divided into four platforms: minor cannabinoids, a replacement for the skin care vitamin retinol and two anti-inflammation compounds known as resveratrol and naringenin.

The company's cannabinoid research and

development is largely focused on non-euphoric compounds that have been shown to have health benefits like treating inflammation, anxiety, obesity and weight gain, gastrointestinal disorders like IBS and Chrohn's disease and insomnia.

In June, the National Institutes of Health awarded Cellibre a \$2 million grant to hasten the company's commercialization of its precision fermentation cannabinoid products, which the company could start providing to pharmaceutical companies as soon as 2025.

Cellibre argues its method of cannabinoid production is significantly cheaper and quicker than traditional agricultural methods.

'When you're doing agricultural-extracted natural products, you have to wait for those plants to grow, you have to do the extraction, it's a one-to-three-month process to create your chemical entity," Chiarelli said. "Our fermentations run in four days."

Beyond cannabinoids, Cellibre is producing a compound called bakuchiol, which has many of the same effects as retinol, a form of Vitamin A, but isn't as harsh on the skin.

The company worked with researchers at the Salk Institute to develop the compound without using the agricultural source, typically the Cullen corylifolium plant native to India, and produced an in-house bakuchiol compound in fewer than four months for less

than \$100,000.

Chiarelli estimated that with the European Union heavily regulating the use of retinol in cosmetics that products like bakuchiol has the chance to become a significant skincare product in the near future.

"We may commercialize directly or partner with a large chemical company in some sort of way, since they already have distribution,"

The other two compounds Cellibre focuses on, naringenin and resveratrol, are found in grapefruits and grapes, respectively, and both have potential uses outside of the health and beauty industry, such as being used in resins and polymers.■

# Premier Foodie Event Increasingly Drawing Tourists

**TOURISM:** San Diego Food + Wine No. 1 Culinary Fest in Nation

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego Food + Wine Festival is growing up in some of the sweetest and most savory of ways.

Celebrating its 20th year, the annual event along San Diego Bay with the finale at Liberty Station has become a major player in the culinary scene, seamlessly meshing the region's wine, agriculture and epicurean worlds together – and bringing in an increasing number of out-of-town guests while drawing the locals who love it.

Since 2004, the weeklong festival has been a place to celebrate San Diego County's rich agricultural history, culinary diversity and award-winning wines along with the region's vibrant dining culture.

Funded in part with the city of San Diego Tourism Marketing District assessment funds, the SDFW is one of the largest of its kind in the United States. USA Today has awarded it the No. 1 wine and food festival in the country two years in a row.

This year's event is slated to run from Nov. 2 to Nov. 10 along the Port of San Diego's Embarcadero Marina Park North at San Diego Bay, with the Grand Fiesta on the last day of the event at Liberty Station's Ingram Plaza.

In 2023, the festival drew about 11,000 attendees – some of whom booked close to 6,000 hotel room nights. More of the same is expected this year.

The festival's partnership with hotels and airlines offers visitors convenient travel and accommodation packages, which encourages longer stays and higher spending per visitor.

"It's been an incredible journey to watch this event grow from its early days to what it is now a truly iconic culinary experience,"

said Michelle Metter, co-founder and producer of the 20th Annual San Diego Food + Wine Festival.

"Over the past two decades, we've seen the San Diego Food + Wine Festival evolve into not just a destination event but a point of pride for the city. San Diego has always had a strong culinary identity, and this festival has helped showcase that on an international stage. The festival has played a significant role in shaping San Diego's reputation as a vibrant

hub for culinary tourism, drawing enthusiasts from around the world to experience what our chefs, local farms and winemakers have to offer alongside some of the most dynamic domestic and international producers who join throughout the week."

#### **Festival Highlights**

SDFW is supported by partnerships with corporations such as the James Beard Foundation, KPBS and Southwest Airlines. The sponsorships help offset event costs while providing companies branding opportunities. Businesses can engage directly with a targeted demographic of food lovers, wine aficionados and professionals in the culinary world.

The SDFW showcases a vast array regions, beyond San Diego and local Southern California vineyards to international producers from Napa Valley, Italy, France, Spain and beyond. The culinary offerings are equally diverse, with cuisines from around the world represented.

This year's week-long lineup of events includes celebrity chef dinners, wine tastings and seminars, cooking classes, experts weighing in on wine tasting, food pairing and sustainable practices and interactive culinary panels. Hundreds of exhibitors, including wineries, craft breweries, spirit brands and gourmet

food purveyors are joining.

The event's signature offerings are the Grand Decant; Grand Tasting; celebrity chef dinners featuring collaborative multi-course meals by the nation's top chefs; the SommCom summit for sommeliers and wine professionals offering master classes and certifications; and wine dinners/culinary showcases throughout the week with wine-paired meals and food

Friends of James Beard Foundation will present the Grand Decant on Nov. 8, showcasing top chefs and more than 800 wines and spirits, which will allow brands to gain exposure among wine enthusiasts, restaurateurs

and influencers.

The Grand Tasting on Nov. 9 will offer hundreds of wines and spirits from local, national and international producers are available for sampling. Food from more than 60 chefs and restaurants, including many Michelin-starred and James Beard-nominated chefs, are also part of it.

The Grand Fiesta finale at Liberty Station on Nov. 10 will highlight Baja cuisine and feature a "Taco TKO" event. It will be a vibrant celebration of our border

region's rich culinary heritage, Metter said.

The festival partners with the Consulate of Mexico and culinary leaders from Baja to celebrate shared culture," she said. "It's not just about bringing flavors from Baja to San Diego, it's a deep cultural exchange that honors the multicultural essence of our region. The Grand Fiesta is the perfect culmination of our week-long festival. It's lively, colorful, and full of bold flavors, with some of the best chefs from both sides of the border coming together. It's a beautiful way to celebrate the ties between our communities and our shared passion for food."

Metter also said philanthropy has always been at the heart of the event.

"Over the past 20 years we've awarded close to \$600,000 in scholarships to chefs, culinary students, and hospitality professionals," she said. "Our goal is to cultivate a vibrant, sustainable workforce right here in San Diego. The scholarships provide essential opportunities for young talent to gain education and experience, which in turn benefits the entire industry.

"These funds not only support individual growth but also enrich the local food scene by nurturing homegrown talent. We want San Diego to be a place where culinary professionals can thrive, and we're proud that the festival

can help foster that."

#### **Tempting the Tourists**

The culinary world of San Diego has also grown up and Kerri **Kapich**, chief operating officer of the San Diego Tourism Authority, said that when SDTA officials talk to people across the country, they hear that San Diego's culinary scene "is really fantastic," from great restaurants and produce via the myriad farms that dot the county to the seafood-focused menus, countywide sustainability

efforts, "and also the whole Cali-Baja thing, the vibe across border."

"It's something that is seen and recognized by people across the country," Kapich said. "And while culinary gets recognized for San Diego, we also have our craft breweries and the craft cocktail scene. We just have a great experience here. The festival is a perfect embodiment of the great things about San Diego and the whole Cali-Baja region in terms of the culinary experience.'

Although the SDTA doesn't have specific statistics related to the fest, it says wine tastings remain a major pull for travelers.

SDTA reports that about 1.3 million visitors participated in a wine tasting in 2022 (similar to the number of people who came to watch a spectator sport or go on a whale watching or harbor cruise but slightly less than the 1.8 million who went to a craft brewery).

Additionally, travel parties that engaged in wine tastings spent significantly more in-market during their stay than other visitors. Visitors participating in a wine tasting spent on average \$1,930 per travel party per trip to San Diego – nearly double the average of \$1,052.

#### **Evolving Through the Years**

Metter said the festival's journey began "with a mission to create an annual showcase that casts a national and international spotlight on the vibrant city of San Diego, surrounding bioregion and its incredibly talented and passionate chefs, farmers, fisherman, winemakers and producers.'

"We are evolving as a multi-genre, multi-cultural festival that is mission and value-led," Metter said. "A festival with soul that inspires and entertains, that is as diverse as it is delicious and where luminaries and innovators will converge in one truly epic week alongside our new partners like the James Beard Foundation and Food Tank."

In addition to tastings, the festival offers panels and educational sessions that discuss

broader issues like sustainability, food systems and the future

The discussions attract thought leaders from the food industry, enhancing the festival's role as a platform for business innovation and sustainability initiatives. SDFW has become a platform for luminaries engaged in the good food moment to join forces to advocate for change in food systems.

This year's thought leaders at the festival include Danielle Nierenberg, president of the commu-

nity-drive think tank for food, the nonprofit Food Tank.

Nierenberg, an activist, advocate and author, is an authority on agriculture and issues relating to the food system in the United States and around the world. She founded Food Tank in 2013 with **Bernard Pollack** to focus on building a global community for safe, healthy and nourished eating - and eaters.

She said she likes what she sees in the region from the agriculture standpoint, and that among topics planned, she will speak on the "good food movement" and the importance of local farmers.

'Wonderful things are happening in San Diego in the food and agriculture space around organic and regenerative agriculture, around chefs who care about more than farm-to-table,' she said. "They're thinking a nose-to-tail cooking and how to prevent food waste from vegetable scraps and that kind of thing... I think we need to put farmers at the center of these conversations and make sure that all decisions around food and agriculture systems are far more driven and far more centered where they have, literally, a seat at the table."■


































































# Beam Global Launches New EV Chargers, Desalination System

**EV TECH:** Innovation Spree Follows Company's Recent European Expansion

#### ■ By ELI WALSH

SAN DIEGO – Renewable energy tech company Beam Global (Nasdaq: BEEM) has announced a suite of new products over the last two months, aiming to make it cheaper and easier to charge electric vehicles and bikes and desalinate water.

Beam said it will soon begin providing the company's BeamWell water desalination and e-mobility delivery system to areas of the world currently facing humanitarian crises that do not have reliable access to clean potable water.

BeamWell systems can intake salt water and remove salt and other contaminants, storing up to 3,000 liters of clean drinking water. The system is also deployed with four electric scooters and charging docks for each of them, making it easier to bring fresh water to areas that are hard or impossible to navigate with a car.

Both the desalination process and the electric scooters are powered by an array of solar panels affixed to the top of the BeamWell system, preventing the need for a generator or

any type of fuel.

Be a m Global CEO **Desmond**Wheatley said the company's primary intention is to deploy BeamWell systems in Gaza, whose resident have been in

an active warzone since the Oct. 7, 2023 attack on Israel by Hamas that ignited the current conflict.

According to the **United Nations**, those in Gaza are living on an average of 4.7 liters of water per person per day, far below the 15-liter minimum recommended during emergencies

by the **World Health Organization**. The vast majority of the territory's water and sewage treatment plants have also been shut down for months, according to **Oxfam**.

International charities including UNICEF, with the support of the Australian and Swedish governments, are providing clean water to

some 900,000 people, but the UN estimates 70% of the total population only has access to salty and contaminated water.

"This is really about saving lives," Wheatley said. "It's about enough water to drink,

According to research conducted by ecoATM, an average American adult has 2.4 unused phones gathering dust in their home, amounting to an estimated 150 million smartphones that could be exchanged for cash at one of the company's recycling

ecoATM Gazelle kiosks. ecoATM kiosks accept cell phones, MP3 players and tablets,

accept cell phones, MP3 players and tablets, according to the company, with 70% of cash payouts offered in exchange for old and outdated devices being spent in the same store where a kiosk is located.

"We're excited to expand our network and help our new retailers provide shoppers with a

# Home Prices Hold Steady

**REAL ESTATE:** Average Single-Family Home Price Stays at \$1M; Condos Drop 22%

#### ■ By RAY HUARD

SAN DIEGO COUNTY – Amid a slight uptick in interest rates, the median price of existing single-family homes in San Diego County was unchanged in September at \$1 million and sales fell by nearly 14% from August to September, according to the Greater San Diego Association of Realtors.

Condo and townhome prices took a hit, with the median price dropping 22% from August to September from \$675,666 to \$646,000.

A year ago, in September 2024, the median price of a resale single-family home was \$992,500 and the median price of condos and townhomes was \$660,000.

Condo and townhome sales were down 4% from August to September.

On the plus side, the inventory of single-family homes on the market has improved, according to Association President **Spencer Lugash.** 

"We're still bullish on the prospects of lower interest rates," Lugash said.

Ryan Mathys of Compass said that the August-to-September drop in home prices is fairly typical for this time of year in a normal market as opposed to the overheated market of 2022 and 2023, when a shortage of homes for sale pushed the median price of single-family homes to more than \$1 million.

"What we're seeing is a much more balanced market than it was in the last several years," Mathys said. "It's pretty balanced between buyers and sellers being in control."

being in control."

The rising inventory of homes on the market is encouraging, but Mathys said that uncertainty over where interest rates are headed is putting a damper on the market, both for sellers, who are reluctant to give up low interest mortgages, and buyers reluctant to make a commitment.

"We've had several buyers, they're not completely stopping their search, but they're hitting the pause button, waiting to see if interest rates come down," Mathys said.

"A lot of families are in homes where they might need more space, but it's hard to give up that low-mortgage rate," Mathys said.

He predicted that rates would have to drop to about 5% to 5.7% to see a significant rise in inventory.

Looking ahead, Mathys said that he expects a modest rise in prices, at best.

"It's going to be a balanced market and kind of steady. I don't expect prices to go up dramatically. I don't expect them to drop dramatically," Mathys said.

The most expensive single-family home sold in September was a 5,000-square-foot Del Mar home with five bedrooms and five bathrooms overlooking the ocean that went for \$15.5 million.

#### **Apartment Rents Relatively Flat**

Apartment rents in San Diego County showed little change in October, with the monthly median rent county-wide for a one-bedroom apartment unchanged from September at \$2,400, according to Zumper, an apartment listing service.

The median rent for a two-bedroom apartment fell 1.2% in October to \$3,200, according to **Zumper**.

Coronado had the most expensive apartments, with a median rent of \$3,530 for a one-bedroom apartment and \$5,380 for a two-bedroom apartment.

El Cajon has consistently had the lowest rents in the county, settling at \$1,750 for a one-bedroom apartment and \$2,300 for a two-bedroom apartment.

# Barefoot Luxury is Promise of Renovated Pacific Beach Hotel HOSPITALITY: Pacific Terrace Hotel Puts \$3M Into Extensive Refresh

SAN DIEGO – Pacific Terrace Hotel in Pacific Beach has completed a \$3 million renovation that took two years.

The boutique hotel, a part of the Bartell Hotels chain, promises "sophisticated barefoot luxury" with the new look, which General Manager **Sandra Kauffman** said gives it an airy, contemporary feel with a brighter color palette of white and turquoise.

Prior to the renovation, the hotel décor was what Kauffman described as classic with earth tones predominating – a look that had become somewhat dated.

"It was important for us to refresh this space to meet the evolving expectations of our guests and maintain our reputation for providing exceptional stays," Kauffman said. "Our first goal was to keep our repeat guests happy. Many have come with their parents or grandparents, and they return with their own children."

Designed by **Liz Bartell**, the hotel owner and lead designer, every bit of the beachfront hotel was touched in the renovation, from all 73 guestrooms, suites and junior suites to the hallways, lobby and swimming pool.

The hotel, which opened in 1986, underwent a series of renovations in the past, but none were this extensive, Kauffman said.

The new look starts right at the entrance, with a refurbished lobby that has new rattan-style furniture replacing heavier traditional pieces.

The new front desk was custom built with a quartz top and front in shades of blue, lavender and gray with a backdrop of handcrafted woodwork in shades of light tan replacing a darker reception desk with a granite top.

The feel of the lobby is meant to convey that barefoot luxury that is the theme of the hotel to distinguish it from more formal hotels.

"Barefoot luxury is where our guests walk around in their robes to go to the beach or to go to the hot tub and they feel comfortable doing that," Kauffman said. "Because we are so close to the beach and we are San Diego,

we are known for our warm hospitality where it is very personal."

#### **Small and Personal**

Beyond the lobby, the walls and hallways were stripped bare, and the wallpaper was replaced, with an emphasis on lighter colors.

"It's mostly light, woven wallpaper and gorgeous stone on the floor," Kauffman said.

The renovation was just as extensive in the hotel's **Terrace Café**.

"We literally gutted the kitchen. We created a beverage bar and it has a new expresso machine," Kauffman said.

The café furniture was replaced with chairs that have a woven look to them and light wood tables with stone tops. "We went lighter and bright," Kauffman said.

New furniture in the rooms includes combination dresser/desks with a 10-foot-long white stone tops and separate tables that tuck beneath the dressers

Stepping outside the hotel, iron gates leading to the pool were replaced with glass to add "that more open view looking out at the ocean from our patios," Kauffman said.

All but one of the guest rooms and suites have balconies or patios, 33 have full ocean views, and 34 have partial views.

The rooms and suites range from 410 square feet to 850 square feet. Eight of the suites have whirlpool tubs.

Nightly room rates range from \$304 to \$1,599, depending on the season and type of room.

As extensive as the renovation was, Kauffman said that underlying it all was keeping the feeling of intimacy that the hotel has developed.

"Part of our story and our brand is, we are small," Kauffman said. "People come here and there is that aspect of being more personal."





#### What do you tell investors who are anxious about market volatility?

Financial market volatility often undermines an investor's willingness to stick with their long-term investment strategy. Unfortunately for many investors, historical data shows this lack of confidence tends to happen at precisely the wrong time and manifests in investors being underinvested during strong market reversals.

Decades of stock market research reveal that the biggest gains over the lifetime of a portfolio come in the short window after a trough, making it extremely costly to miss these few days. An investor who sat out the best 10 days of the last 10 years – less than half a percent of the 2,500 trading days in the period – would have lost more than \$42,000 on each \$100,000 invested. Being out of the market for the 40 best days in that period – or just four days from each year – would have yielded negative returns. These are the market conditions that emphasize why you have a plan and the importance of sticking to it – through good times and bad.

#### How should people prepare for a changing tax landscape?

Current estate tax exemption rates are the highest they have been in history, allowing individuals an unprecedented \$13.61 and married couples \$27.22 million to give away during life or death tax free. The temporary exemption, however, is scheduled to sunset on December 31, 2025 – at which point, barring action by Congress, it will revert to approximately \$7 million per individual, adjusted for inflation.

Current exclusion levels represent a significant opportunity. In similarly fluctuating tax environments, however, we have observed some families acting precipitously as deadlines approached. # AMM on What to Look for in the Right Financial Advisor for You

## What is the fiduciary duty and how does it help clients?

The fiduciary duty is a requirement to act in the best interest of one's client, to give advice that is prudent and loyal, and to eliminate or disclose any conflicts of interest. In the context of wealth management, registered investment advisers (RIAs) are always fiduciaries when working with their clients.

Not all financial advisors are required to uphold the fiduciary duties of loyalty and care in their interactions with clients. It is important to ask any financial advisor you are considering working with whether or not they uphold the fiduciary standards at all times.

#### How do I compare wealth advisors?

A wealth advisor should always provide you with their Form ADV, which explains how they get paid, their investment philosophy, and whether they have been subject to any disciplinary actions. It is important to determine what potential conflicts of interest they may have.

Conflicts of interest are always possible in the wealth advisor landscape so any responsible advisor will be able to explain the potential conflicts simply and easily. They should also tell you how they plan to reduce or mitigate these conflicts as they arise.

Fiduciaries are required to disclose conflicts of interest as they arise so that they are transparent and can be taken into consideration along with their advice. Any professional working for compensation who claims there are no conflicts of interest is not representing themselves accurately.

# What is the best way to make charitable donations?

The best way to make charitable donations depends on your tax situation. If you are over 73 and are currently taking RMDs (required minimum distributions), donating directly from your IRA may provide the most tax benefit. If you are in a high tax bracket, donating shares of appreciated stock may be the best way.

Setting up a donor-advised fund can also provide

# Lucia Capital Group on Preparing for Future Market Opportunities

# What should investors consider doing right now to protect their wealth and prepare for future opportunities?

We've had a nice run up in the markets this year and let's not get over our skis. Protecting your wealth should be a priority and one of the key techniques our financial advisors use with clients is value averaging. What this does is help create the discipline to sell risky assets at a profit and reallocate to less risky assets for the purpose of investing in more attractive assets when opportunities arise. And while waiting, you can still comfortably earn around 5% or so with taking little to no risk. Today, the opportunity cost of taking money off the table is low. However, for investors that want to remain fully invested while adding additional risk management to their portfolio, I am seeing our advisors using option strategies and allocating to alternative investments for their clients.

# With short-term interest rates in decline, what strategies are your portfolio managers considering now?

This really is a yield curve discussion. With the Fed cutting rates and looking like that may continue for the foreseeable future, asset managers are trying to figure out where the opportunity is in fixed income. Keeping in mind bonds prices have an inverse relationship with interest rate movements. At the same time, a normalized yield curve is when longer term bonds pay a higher yield than shorter term bonds. The yield curve has been inverted for some time and is starting the process to normalize. And while that is happening, there still is inflation that is making the asset manager's jobs more difficult because the greatest opportunity when rates fall is typically on the longer end of the yield curve. But that's where the most pain can be if you get it wrong. Our asset management team

believes positioning in the 2- to 4-year maturity range offers the best balance of return and risk.

## What year-end tax planning opportunities should business owners be aware of?

There are several strategies to consider for year-end tax planning. Here are a few of my favorites. 1) Tax loss harvesting - everyone has some losses in their portfolio, realize those losses to offset your realized gains. 2) Charitable Contributions - Don't donate cash, instead donate your appreciated stock. You'll get full benefit of the value for the deduction and avoid paying taxes on the gain. 3) Max fund your retirement plans - Remember, every dollar you contribute to your 401(k) reduces your taxable income. 4) Fund your Health Savings Account - You get the deduction today, tax free growth and tax free withdrawal for qualified medical expenses.

# What advice would you give business owners about managing their personal wealth?

For most business owners, their business is their largest financial asset and their investment portfolio is more like their side hustle. A skilled financial advisor can help business owners bridge the gap between their business and personal wealth. There are many research studies that state hiring skilled financial advisors can add up to 3% in additional net returns. I argue that the value can be significantly higher when working with advisors that focus on helping business owners with maximizing their business valuation. 1) Start with a plan. After the increase in the federal tax standard deduction and decrease in the SALT deduction, some individuals have not been able to take a tax deduction for charitable deductions. What are PNC Private Bank clients in similar situations doing?

The current standard deduction of \$14,600 for an individual and \$29,200 for a married couple may exceed an individual's standard deduction and thus eliminated the income tax benefit of charitable gifting. There are several strategies to implore but options may include doing a Qualified Charitable Deduction ("QCD") from a Traditional IRA account or possibly making larger gifts less often to were hopefully lumping charitable gifts could allow you to accumulate deductions and itemize in some years. In short, this ruling is a reminder to have a succession plan but to also review the plan periodically to insure that it continues to satisfy your objectives.

#### How does the sale or transition of a family business present unique challenges and opportunities for a family?

#### As we begin thinking about the yearend holidays, what should we also think about year-end tax planning?

As we near the end of 2024, the basic exclusion amount for the federal estate and gift tax is \$13.61 million. Unless Congress takes further action, on Jan. 1, 2026, the exclusion amount will be approximately halved (to 2017 levels, indexed for inflation). We are very close to that expiration date. Now may be a good time to talk to your attorney about planning to use the increased exclusion amount. If you intend to use the increased exclusion amount, I suggest not waiting until 2025 to meet with your attorney. I also encourage you to consult with your tax and financial advisors with respect to your year-end plans.■

# Navy Executive's Influence Extends Into the Wider Community

Mark Compton, a top technology executive with the U.S. Navy in San Diego, has been named the 2024 Cybersecurity Executive of the Year.

Compton is command information security officer at Naval Information Warfare Systems Command (NAVWAR) in Old Town. The job is the equivalent of chief information security officer (CISO) in the civilian world. NAVWAR is the Navy's electronics and IT command. It plays a pivotal role in shaping the Navy's cybersecurity posture and serves as the Navy's information technology/cybersecurity technical authority.

Compton is credited for being a driving force in the cybersecurity community, leading key initiatives that have not only advanced cybersecurity innovation but also contributed to workforce development and regional resiliency.

#### 'A Consummate Collaborator'

"Mark Compton is a stalwart of San Diego's cybersecurity industry and works tirelessly in service of our nation," said **Lisa Easterly**, president and CEO of San Diego's **Cyber Center of Excellence** (CCOE) and one of the judges for the Cybersecurity Stewardship Awards. "He is a consummate collaborator and his passion for developing talent, innovation and community resiliency has helped launch and guide many of CCOE's most successful programs and initiatives.

"Mark is also an insightful thought leader, educating the larger community on lessons learned, best practices and resources available through the **U.S. Department of Defense** and government agencies. Our region is very lucky to have such a dedicated cybersecurity leader in Mark and we are delighted to celebrate all his contributions as the Executive of the Year!"

"Frankly, I'm humbled at being selected," Compton said, noting "there are so many other outstanding cyber professionals who provide great leadership for their organizations, both inside and outside the Department of Defense. ...

"It was a bit of a surprise," he continued. "But I also feel honored. It's really recognition of a large number of cyber professionals in the NAVWAR enterprise."

Under Compton's guidance, NAVWAR has been at the forefront of groundbreaking cybersecurity initiatives that have transformed both the organization and the broader community.

He has been instrumental in advancing workforce development through programs such as CyberHire, NFAR Cyber, CAREERworks and **Girl Scouts** workshops. These initiatives, which aim to create a more inclusive and diverse cybersecurity workforce, reflect Compton's commitment to fostering talent and creating pathways for underrepresented groups in the field.

#### From P-3 Aircraft to Program Management

Compton has had a notable career in the Navy, particularly in the field of information security and cybersecurity.

The executive spent 27 years in uniform. Between 1980 and 2007, Compton served as a naval flight officer. He flew P-3 aircraft in the Pacific, from bases in Hawaii, California and Washington state. The Navy uses its P-3 aircraft for anti-submarine



warfare and maritime patrol. Compton also had two tours of duty on the aircraft carrier USS Forrestal out of Florida.

Compton also spent considerable time as a program manager. He spent approximately two years in the private sector in San Diego before returning to Navy employment.

His home has been NAVWAR – which prior to 2019 was called SPAWAR (Space and Naval Warfare Systems Command). For a while, Compton worked on the Joint Tactical Radio System program, also known as JTRS. From 2014 to 2018, he served as the deputy program manager for the Navy's Command and Control Systems Program Office (known internally as PMW 150), where he was responsible for providing operational and tactical command and control capabilities. This included targeting support, chemical-biological warnings, and logistics support for the Navy, U.S. Marine Corps, joint and coalition war-fighters.

In September 2018, Compton became the CISO at NAVWAR. In this role, he has been instrumental in driving cyber resilience through situational awareness and incident response.

"I think were exceedingly fortunate at NAVWAR of being part of a cyber ecosystem that is so vibrant and growing here in San Diego area," Compton said. The ecosystem takes in not only the military and government, but the defense industrial base, other industry, the commercial sector and academia.

"We're all in this together in the San Diego ecosystem and this presents great benefit and great opportunity."

#### **More About NAVWAR**

As one of San Diego's largest cyber employers, NAVWAR is at the forefront of efforts to protect data, technology, critical infrastructure and national security. In collaboration with CCOE, NAVWAR has served in an advisory role on several key initiatives aimed at enhancing cybersecurity awareness and resilience.

Defenders are increasingly utilizing AI and machine learning to analyze malware and log data at scale, as well as to scan entire systems for anomalies and automatically respond to threats. AI can act as a force multiplier for defensive

teams working to safeguard their organizations and data.

#### Phishing attacks are on the rise, threatening businesses worldwide.

Phishing remains the primary method used by attackers to gain initial access to networks, with over 2.6 billion interactions detected by Comcast Business. Additionally, over 90% of the phishing interactions Comcast Business blocked were designed to direct victims to phishing sites hosting malware. The trend underscores the need for robust anti-phishing technologies, user education, and email gateway platforms to combat this growing threat.

#### Bad actors are employing advanced lateral movement techniques to navigate networks.

Remote services were the most exploited method for lateral movement, with over 409 million events detected by Comcast Business. Employing tools like Endpoint Detection and Response (EDR) and Managed Detection and Response (MDR) can help IT staff identify early-stage threats by monitoring network activity for anomalies in user behavior. They help protect devices connected to enterprise networks by using AI to proactively detect, investigate, remove, and remediate malware, phishing, and ransomware.

#### Attackers are increasingly using encrypted channels and proxies to hide their command and control (C&C) communications.

By exploiting these protocols, attackers can mask their malicious activities and evade detection. Domain Name System (DNS) tunneling remains a popular technique to bypass traditional security measures, with over eight million observed

events. Similarly, Transmission Control Protocol (TCP) was used in 104,000 events to provide reliable communication channels, often with encrypted payloads that further obscure malicious activities. The use of Windows Remote Management (Win-RM), which saw nearly 78 million events, was also prevalent. These methods underscore the need for sophisticated detection tools to identify and mitigate covert malicious activities.

#### Distributed Denial of Service (DDoS) attacks and ransomware pose significant risks.


Comcast Business identified and blocked over one billion attempts to destroy data. Additionally, there were more than 126 million blocked instances of malware or botnets designed specifically for financial theft, underscoring the financial motivations behind many cyber-attacks. DDoS attacks remained a major threat to Comcast Business customers, with 103,000 reported events. This surge emphasizes the need for robust DDoS protection and mitigation strategies.

The report provides CISOs, CIOs, and security leaders with a deep dive into how cyber threats can breach and then spread across global networks. This analysis enables them to make informed security decisions for protecting critical assets. The report's trends and findings underscore the importance of adopting a multi-layered approach to cybersecurity to bolster defenses against evolving global threats.

key areas like the Rocky Mountains region. In March 2023, the company acquired **Johnston & Associates**, in Cherry Creek, Colorado, which added \$400 million in assets under management. The Johnston move was then the company's fourth acquisition in five years.

"The addition of the talented All Season team will immediately strengthen our capabilities in this key wealth market," said AlphaCore Founder and CEO **Dick Pfister**.

Focused on delivering outstanding research-based wealth management solutions to their high-net-worth clients – typically those who have between \$1 million and \$20 million in investible assets – AlphaCore is one of the fastest growing RIA firms in the U.S.

AlphaCore has grown from zero assets since its 2015 launch to nearly over \$3 billion today and continues to be on the **San Diego Business Journal**'s lists of fastest growing companies.

client and ends with keeping things fun and creating win-win solutions along the way, which keeps the company expanding strategically, Pfister said.



#### **Insurance Firms Weigh Risks**

Good habits such as software patching are rewarded in other ways, such as when the time comes for an organization to renew its cyber insurance policy.

Not updating software – thereby increasing the chance and cost of an incident – is unacceptable, said **Jim Skeen Jr.**, founder of **Lockton San Diego**. "It's akin to leaving your doors unlocked, being surprised by theft and expecting sympathy from others," he said.

Skeen noted that over time, it is often less expensive to prevent a cyber incident than to pay for one through insurance. "Invest in your enterprise and your people," he said. "Doing so will make you a better risk, positioned to negotiate more favorable insurance terms and pricing."

Think in terms of minimum-security standards, Skeen advised. Good cyber hygiene will also include using multifactor authentication and employing authenticators; backing up data and isolating clouds; encrypting sensitive data; and restricting administrative privileges.

Skeen said that cybersecurity should involve every member of an organization's team. He added that executives would be wise to draw up an incident response plan and practice the use of such a plan.

"We reap what we sow," Skeen said. "There are no shortcuts."

#### **Simple Steps Outlined**

Skeen and Daly spoke with the **San Diego Business Journal** recently for an article series on
Cybersecurity Awareness Month. Presented in

association with San Diego's Cyber Center of Excellence (CCOE), the October series has highlighted simple steps all people can take to practice better cyber hygiene. Other steps include the use of strong passwords, recognizing and reporting phishing and social engineering and other good practices described earlier in this story.

Guidance on these steps is as close as the internet. One resource is CCOE at sdccoe.org. A second

is the federal government's **Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency** at cisa.gov.

A third resource is the **San Diego Regional Cyber Lab**, hosted by the city of San Diego and overseen by Daly.

"We're available to partner with anybody," Daly said. "We're a resource for anyone, from regional businesses and government agencies down to an individual setting up network security."

The lab provides resources for local organizations, including "sandbox" areas. These are isolated computer systems that let cyber professionals simulate attack scenarios and take part in ethical hacking exercises.

The lab also provides software resources that might be out of reach to smaller entities. Case in point: the **Encinitas Union School District** was recently able to use "a very well-respected cyber intelligence tool that monitors the dark web," Daly said. The cost of using such products can be prohibitive, but here, the school district was able to use it through the cyber lab.

The software Daly spoke of was from **Recorded Future**, whose clients include the governments of 45 countries and more than 50% of the Fortune 100. **Mastercard** agreed to acquire the business this fall for \$2.65 billion.

A second resource from the San Diego Regional Cyber Lab is My eCISO.

My eCISO is an AI chatbot trained on the National Institute of Standards and Technology cybersecurity framework known as NIST 1.1. My eCISO interviews the client in a straightforward, question-and-answer manner, using natural language. As the interview progresses, the chatbot evaluates the organization's existing cybersecurity situation and recommends steps for improvement. At the end of the interview, the chatbot gives the user a report card, assigning a letter grade to different aspects of cybersecurity and suggesting ways to improve an organization's cyber defenses. My eCISO was designed with security and privacy controls. Only the user who submitted data can access it. User conversations are deleted automatically after 30 days, but they can be removed sooner if the user prefers. The service has been well received. "Every

The service has been well received. "Every time I bring it up, people are really impressed by it," Daly said, adding that he was invited to discuss the program before conference attendees convened by **Amazon Web Services**. AWS was among several organizations that contributed to My eCISO.

of females by age 50. Dr. Plikus found his motivation to help these patients when he was younger. "I got hands-on experience working at a Los Angeles hair transplant clinic and saw the deep emotional impact of hair loss on people's lives. It impacts not only their physical appearance but also their self-esteem."

The company declined to disclose its current valuation but shared that it closed an \$11.8 million Series A round of funding in 2022. President and CEO **Frank Fazio** added, "Amplifica plans to initiate its Series B financing in the coming year to advance the development of its proprietary compounds for the treatment of androgenetic alopecia in both male and female patients."

Soon the company plans to incorporate key findings from the recent study into its overall

development program. It'll then initiate additional clinical trials to evaluate the safety and efficacy of the drug while optimizing dosing and durability.

"Looking ahead five years, we envision Amplifica as one of the leaders in the hair growth and regenerative medicine space," added Dr. Plikus. "Our goal is to push the boundaries of what's possible with hair regeneration, providing new, science-backed solutions to patients around the world."

Tijuana," King said. "A lot of people have businesses locally and they go back and forth.

In another twist, the six-story project has some groundfloor apartments designed for people to



run a business out of their home, said Greg Mueller, CEO and principal designer of Tucker Sadler Architects.

"It's a building to allow seniors to continue to work," Mueller said.

In addition to appealing to cross-border tenants, King said that Casa Estilo is targeting people 55 and older "who want prestige and all the bells and whistles that come with that."

That includes concierge service and house cleaning.

"It's very much resort-style living. It's worry-free living," King said. "Our goal is to reach out to people who are getting older and don't want to maintain their homes anymore. They can sell their property while the market is high.

Translated from Spanish, the name of the project means "house of style," a name that is befitting Casa Estilo because "there's nothing else like it in this area," said Derek Edwards, general manager of Casa Estilo.

"We're expecting to run this more like a hotel than just an apartment building," Edwards said. "With Gaylord and some of the other projects surrounding that along the waterfront, Chula Vista is in a prime area to develop these resort style projects."

### **Modern Look**


Describing Casa Estilo's look as "Bohemian," Edwards said, We've got Italian marble in our lobby and lounge areas," adding, We have amenities that kind of blow people away when they come into the building.'

They include a sixth-floor vista lounge that overlooks the San

Diego Country Club with views of San Diego Bay to the west and the mountains to the east.

There's also a fitness center, a yoga studio, an outdoor pool with cabanas, a game room, a dog-washing area and dog run, and a courtyard with multiple fire pits and big-screen tele-

Casa Estilo has 24 studio apartments of 463 square feet, 71 one-bedroom apartments of 579 square feet, 27 two-bedroom apartments



Of the 142 apartments, 16 will be earmarked for low-income ten-

Monthly rents for the market rate apartments range from \$2,410 to \$7,665. Rents for the affordable apartments are based on income.

Most of the apartments have balconies. Two of the apartments are short-term rentals "which we would allow tenants to rent for

family members who come to visit," Edwards

Each of the loft apartments has an elevator to reach the second level. There are no staircases in the loft apartments.

Mueller said that the design is meant to evoke a sense of grandeur.

"As you get above the second floor, you have some of the most incredible views," Mueller said, adding that all of the apartments have

floor-to-ceiling glass.

'My goal was to capture as much natural light as possible," Mueller said. "The idea was to bring as much natural light as possible in from the outside."

Interior hallways, which are 10 feet wide compared to the more typical eight feet, have windows at the end to provide natural light and dark wood accents to go with the overall warm feeling of the structure, Mueller said.

"You don't feel like you're in a tunnel. If you're walking past someone, you don't feel crunched. You can actually stop and have a conversation," Mueller said. "Everything that we incorporated into the building is bringing people together."

Where it's not glass, the exterior façade is sand-colored stucco with copper trim – stucco to mimic the city's historic building and copper to evoke the setting sun.

"If you look at the final color of a sunset, it's copper," Mueller said. "The thing we were looking at doing was to get a very modern look to the building using materials that are common to the Chula Vista area."■

capital for continued innovation and deployment of its platform.

Tristan Barnum, chief marketing officer for Wildfire, said that with the series B funding, "our investors are showing that they believe in Wildfire's growth and want to fan the flame.

'Our growth isn't just about delivering technology products," Barnum said, "it's about empowering our clients with tools built from our expertise in creating the most rewarding shopping experiences on the planet."

### **Revenue Growth for All**

Wildfire enables its clients to embed e-commerce solutions directly into their websites, apps and browser extensions.

"We are experts in building rewards and loyalty programs as a white label platform that drives loyalty and retention and new revenue streams for partners," Glazier said.

Wildfire ranks No. 80 on the 2024 Inc. 5000 in its annual list of the fastest-growing private companies in America, the second consecutive year it made Inc.'s top 100. The company most recently celebrated three-year growth of 479.4%, landing Wildfire in the No. 3 spot on San Diego Business Journal's 2024 list of fastest-growing medium size companies. Wildfire also added 20 employees since last year and now has 70, all working remotely.

Wildfire Systems' AI platform, RevenueEngine, helps content creators monetize product and brand mentions within generated content.

The company's innovative technology platform drove nearly \$600 million in online purchases from merchants last year.

Wildfire's clients include Microsoft, Visa, Royal Bank of Canada and Citi. Its technology is used in services such as the **Acorns** Earn

rewards program, which offers users micro-investments in companies as a reward for shopping at participating brands.

Wildfire works with performance marketing platforms CJ, Impact.com and Rakuten Advertising and others to drive incremental sales for more than 50,000 merchants in 50 countries offering cashback and discounts through its services. Merchants that work with Wildfire include Dell, Macy's and Sephora.

### Staying 'Top of Wallet'

Glazier said that many of Wildfire's clients are looking for solutions to challenges that include building new revenue streams, retaining customers and "staying top-of-mind and topof-wallet" - Wildfire helps clients achieve these goals with loyalty as a profit center.

Wildfire Systems' platform enables financial services organizations and technology companies to provide rewarding online shopping experiences to consumers worldwide through embedding social commerce, cashback rewards programs, digital coupons and shopping tools into their services.

In early October, Wildfire released a 2024 consumer trends report, titled, "Banking on Shopping Rewards: The Value-Added Services Today's Consumers Prefer." Wildfire partnered with research firm Big Village for its survey of 1,000 U.S. consumers 18 and older to determine what's driving their spending behavior online and implications this behavior has on the financial services industry and retail brands.

The report found that most consumers have continued to refine their deal hunting strategies in order to save money when buying products online. The 2024 survey found consumers are using cashback and coupons to earn rewards and save money even more than shopping at discount retailers or buying generic products. Seventy-seven percent of respondents are more interested than ever before in earning cashback

rewards for shopping.

Glazier said the company's survey found that cashback rewards and coupons are an essential value-added service for budget-conscious consumers.

"Consumers are increasingly focused on and interested in saving money," Glazier said. "We just completed some research through our annual consumer survey and once again... many of the habits show they care more and more about saving money when they shop, with services like cash back. Online cash back has truly crossed over to becoming a mainstream behavior. Consumers don't just want it, they have come to expect it. And where do they want to receive it? The survey again said from their existing trusted services that they're already using.

The report also said 54% of respondents expect cashback and coupons from their credit card and 33% expect it from their bank. A majority (64%) of respondents reported they use cashback rewards (30%) and coupons (34%) the most to save money when shopping online, far more than those who reported shopping in an online offer portal or paying with points or miles to save.

### Multifaceted Approaches

In February of this year, TMC awarded Wildfire Systems' Revenue Engine a winner of its 2023 Generative AI Product of the Year Award.

Glazier said that while Wildfire works with some of the world's top corporations, it is also devoted to smaller companies and those making their first ventures into loyalty programs.

'We're working with very big companies that are deploying loyalty programs which are essential to driving revenue or loyalty or engagement," he said. "They will all stack that differently, but it's important because each strategic plan is a priority to them. But we also work with a bunch of startups. Our white label programs (help those who) want to build rewards and loyalty apps or services."

One of the newer startups Glazier said Wildfire recently started working with is a company called Givebacks based out of North Carolina.

Givebacks is a platform designed to help schools, nonprofits and brands raise funds and engage communities. It is used by more than 14,000 schools and has engaged millions of parents across the U.S. and also works with brands, allowing them to connect with customers who value giving back to communities.

"They're a relatively small company but we love working with creative interesting services like that," he said.

Wildfire was also able to help tech startup OctoShop grow.

The Texas-based tech startup began during the pandemic, specializing in price tracking and comparison technology via a browser extension, but needed a new revenue stream that could be integrated with its pre-existing technology.

A cashback program was a natural fit for its business model but before connecting with Wildfire, OctoShop encountered issues implementing an affiliate marketing program that would deliver commission revenue that moved the needle.

Partnering with Wildfire solved those issues, and with intuitive Application Programming Interface and Software Development Kit integrations, OctoShop was able to start generating revenue from its cashback program from thousands of online stores.■

enough water to cook food, enough water to clean up after you've cooked. ... There's not even the hint of luxury about it, it's literally people are dying because of a lack of access to this stuff."

Wheatley said Beam Global can produce several thousand BeamWell systems per year between its two facilities in San Diego and in Serbia. The system also has the potential to benefit victims of natural disasters both domestically and abroad, as well as people living in areas of crisis such as Ukraine, Lebanon and Sudan.

Wheatley added that deploying BeamWell systems internationally will also depend on the approval of multiple parties.

"Our ability to deploy them will not be the gating factor," he said. "I think likely the gating factor will be politics."

Wheatley compared the haste at which the

BeamWell system can be deployed, as well as the company's BeamBike solar-powered electric bike charging ports, to a satellite unfolding once its deployed in space.

"Although its large and heavy, it actually arrives at the customer site or the location where it's needed in its complete condition," he said.

### Curbside EV Chargers Utilize Streetlights

Beam also recently announced the launch of its BeamSpot curbside electric vehicle chargers, which utilize existing streetlight foundations and circuitry to provide sustainable electric vehicle charging to drivers who don't have a dedicated place to install a charging station.

While existing streetlight circuits generally only conduct enough electricity to power a light bulb, the BeamSpot charger can connect to that circuitry and boost electrical output by combining solar and wind energy that is collected by a solar array and small-scale wind turbine atop the charger.

Wheatley argued that while 80% of electric vehicle owners charge their cars at home,

that is largely because EV owners are primarily wealthier households who have larger homes, off-street parking and can afford larger electrical supplies.

"This doesn't describe the typical citizen," he said. "So what we need to do is solve for charging on the curb."

He added that BeamSpot charging systems are far cheaper for local governments than completely converting street infrastructure to accommodate EV chargers.

"They know they're going to have to do a lot of digging up streets and all that sort of stuff," Wheatley said. "This is a way for them to avoid doing that ... The BeamSpot will allow cities to have ubiquitous on-curb charging, but without having to go through with all the costs and everything associated with the construction and electrical work to make that possible."

In the current market, establishing cheap and convenient sources of renewable energy is largely a matter of incumbency and a lack of vision by those who could make electric transportation solutions more ubiquitous, Wheatley argued. "The things I'm talking about here, we're not waiting for a scientific breakthrough or some brand new technology to make this possible," he said. "It works today. We do it, lots of other people do it. It's really more a question of will."

so we wanted to do it right," Naslund said. "I think of it as kind of our classic American small town. It has a really friendly, accommodating spirit about it."

Naslund said the design was "a homage if you will to my memories of growing up in the '60s in La Mesa."

### **Playful Features**

Built in a rounded-L-shape, the most striking feature of Textur is a lattice work roof that soars over a terrace deck of 760 square feet atop a corner segment of the building between the two wings.

"We have a big common space under a trellis that offers really good views to the north and the east," Naslund said.

The siding of that mid-section of the building is paneling applied in a way to create a pattern of vertical and horizontal lines running up and across the face of the structure.

The bottom floor at the corner has floor-toceiling glass wrapping around the commercial space and the 900-square-foot entry lounge.

"Think of it like an engagement ring where you have a central gold band then a jewel that is the focus of everything.

The stucco wings of the building would be the gold band and the rooftop deck, the gem.

First floor ceilings are about 14 feet compared to 10 feet on the upper floors.

"From an urban design, that is an important

element, to make the ground floor seem more grandiose," Naslund said. "We're seeking to get a pretty active pedestrian zone right there at the corner."

Adding to the textured look, apartment balconies tilt in different directions.

"There's kind of a playfulness in the way the balconies work," Naslund said.

In what is a signature look for Studio E, the project has splashes of color – red in this case – with the doorways leading from the balconies into the apartments.

Aside from its distinctive look, Haley and Naslund said that Textur will stand out because the site is on a prominent corner of La Mesa.

"This is a really good location, relative to getting to things. You can catch a bus on

La Mesa Boulevard, you can walk across the street for shopping. You can even walk down the street to **Grossmont Center**," Naslund said.■

of achieving carbon neutrality by 2050 while reducing costs. Former Boeing CEO Dave Calhoun estimated it would cost some \$50 billion to develop a new narrow-body plane

"The commercial aviation industry is looking for real solutions to become more sustainable, more efficient and more profitable," Matyushev said.

The aviation industry currently emits some 900 million tons of carbon dioxide annually, but that figure is expected to climb to 1.8 billion tons by 2040, more than the combined emissions of Germany, the United Kingdom and South Korea.

The 2050 deadline is also largely the reason why development of blended-wing-body designs has accelerated in recent years, Giblin said, despite NASA and Boeing having studied the concept in the late 1990s.

"Because of the inability to meet demand and because of the quality issues out of the likes of Boeing and Airbus today, coupled with the sustainability goals that they've all now set for themselves, which every passing month gets closer and closer to reality, a decision has to be made towards that change (in) technology," Giblin said.

### **Blended-Wing Offers Possible Advantages**

Natilus is also not the only aerospace company focused on the blended-wing design for commercial airline use.

**JetZero**, based in Long Beach, is currently working with the U.S. Air Force, NASA and the Federal Aviation Administration to push a similar design into service by the end of the decade. The company has argued its design, which does not include vertical fins, reduces complexity and will result in lowering fuel burn and emissions by 50 percent.

'We want them to succeed in the same way we want any other manufacturer to succeed," Giblin said. "Because then it props us up as well, and it shows that this is a validating configuration that can be used for commercial space."

Giblin said the Horizon design will have the same footprint as the 737 and A320, preventing airports from needing to make adjustments to their terminals, and interior seating and amenity designs will be left up to individual airlines.

"Some airlines would add more rows and passengers to maximize that volume for their revenue side of things," he said. "Others are seeing it as an opportunity to provide a different product to their customers, meaning a more luxurious product, and actually taking out rows, extending leg room, thinking about things like a lounge or a bar in the back of the airplane."

Natilus is currently in the preliminary design and simulated environment testing phase with the Horizon, but plans to take its first prototype to the wind tunnel in a matter of months, according to Giblin.

"I really want to see this succeed in San Diego, to build on that rich aviation history,' he said. "And I think we're the right people to do it."■

"At Tops, we believe in exploring opportunities to reduce our carbon footprint by investing in sustainable environmental practices, making this partnership with ecoATM a great way to continue these efforts," said Bill Thomas, a sustainability specialist for Tops.

### Going Beyond Grocery Stores

ecoATM is also piloting its kiosks in 25 Aaron's rent-to-own furniture and appliance stores, with the goal of eventually expanding to more of the chain's locations next year.

According to Fried, while the company's kiosks are primarily located in grocery stores and shopping malls, ecoATM is in discussions with multiple potential partners that are outside the grocery industry like Aaron's.

"Every day, we are exploring new retail partnerships, and we are starting to see some amazing ways to automate the in-store tradein experience at some of the world's largest carriers," he said.

ecoATM was originally founded in 2008

and eventually acquired by Outerwall, Inc., in 2013 for \$350 million. In 2016, Outerwall, public at that time and the parent company of the coin-cashing enterprise Coinstar, was purchased by Apollo Global Management, LLC.

Apollo subsequently took Outerwall private and spun off the company's subdivisions - ecoATM Gazelle, Redbox and Coinstar – into independent businesses. Since 2021, ecoATM has raised some \$125 million, including a \$50 million growth equity raise from existing investors in March 2023.

### **Rewards for Recycling**

Once placed in an ecoATM kiosk, recycled devices are sent to the company's reverse logistics facility in Louisville, Kentucky, where they are inspected and their data is wiped.

The devices are then held for a brief period of time to comply with laws regulating secondhand dealers before being sold to refurbishers, parts harvesters, wholesalers and device recyclers. Regular consumers can also purchase used devices through ecoATM's direct-to-consumer platform Gazelle.

"Our entire mission and vision are about enabling consumers to recycle and rewarding

them for recycling," Fried said. "We pay a minimum of \$1 for each device that (is) recycled. We have diverted 50 million devices from landfills and enhanced affordable global access to smartphones."

Whereas mobile device and smartphone recycling programs run by companies like Apple typically offer store credit in return for trading in or recycling old devices, Fried argued ecoATM differentiates itself by immediately paying customers in cash.■




